Governor Establishes Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship



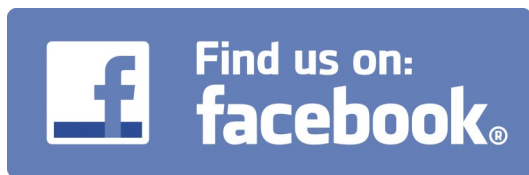
Gov. Matt Bevin established the Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship to assist Kentuckians learn skills needed in particular industries. An applicant must have a high school diploma or GED and NOT have an associates or higher degree.

For the 2017-2018 school year, the scholarship can be used to study for a certificate, credential, diploma or an associate's degree in one of five key areas: health care, advanced manufacturing, transportation/logistics, business services/information technology, or construction.

Students can receive the scholarship for up to four semesters, until they have earned at least 12 credit hours, or until they have received an associate's degree.


To keep the scholarship, students must earn at least a 2.0 GPA each semester. The scholarship will be administered by KHEAA (Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority). The application will be available on kheaa.com later this spring.

Educational Opportunity Centers, aTRIO Program

The Educational Opportunity Centers (EOC) is a TRIO program funded by the US Department of Education. The EOC program provides counseling and information on college admissions to low income and first generation adults age 19 or older who desire to enter, reenter, or continue a program of postsecondary education.

The EOC program also provides services to improve the financial and economic literacy of participants. An important objective of the program is to counsel participants on financial aid options, including basic financial planning skills, and to assist in the application process.

The goal of the EOC program is to increase the number of adult participants who enroll in postsecondary education institutions.
